Greetings From The Pastor TOUGH DECISIONS

It can be safely argued that alarms regarding our financial situation should have gone off a long time ago. However, dwelling on that point now is of no value as we ponder our future.

On the issue of finances the big truth that we cannot avoid is that we are spending three times more than we receive in offerings. That is the major reason our investments have shrunk by 44% in the last seven years.

The Finance Committee will continue to work hard to reign in our spending. The Stewardship/Evangelism Committee will look for ways to increase attendance and offerings. That effort must include talking to inactive members as well as looking for new members.

Those who worship regularly are pretty much maxed out in terms of what they can contribute. Therefore, participation in worship services is needed on the part of those who are not now attending. I have been frustrated in my efforts to get a foot in the door of the homes of our inactive members. It would help me a great deal if you can convince someone you know to allow me to sit down with them and discuss their potential involvement at St. James. But perhaps our biggest problem is the atmosphere of "hostility" that continues to pervade our scene. I hear it from other Pastors as well as other members of the community. Unless we can change the way we are perceived to be treating each other all efforts to get St. James back on track will fail.

I am not completely ready to throw in the towel but if there is not a marked willingness by the end of the summer to establish some direction for the future of this congregation then my tenure will be over. I have told the council that I will not hang around just to help you spend your reserves. If everyone who has requested to be retained on our rolls would show they are willing to **participate** in the life and work of this congregation then I am willing stay and do my part. That is a big "IF." It can happen but only if **ALL OF US ARE REALLY SERIOUS** about some future direction for this congregation.

- Proof of Registration will be required before a scholarship is issued.





- One metal nail clippers (attached file optional)
