Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ of St. James Lutheran Congregation,

As I write this letter, I see the snow outside my window. This winter is a hard one. February means the beginning of Lent. My mind does not want to go there right now. But yet the forty days of Lent means that it will officially be Spring before the Last Sunday in Lent. That is good news!

Lent is a forty-day period before Easter. It begins on Ash Wednesday. We skip Sundays when we count the forty days, because Sundays commemorate the Resurrection. Lent is a season of soul-searching and repentance. It is a season for reflection and taking stock. Lent originated in the very earliest days of the Church as a preparatory time for Easter, when the faithful rededicated themselves and when converts were instructed in the faith and prepared for baptism. By observing the forty days of Lent, the individual Christian imitates Jesus' withdrawal into the wilderness for forty days.

Often some people give up something for Lent like chocolate or other sweets. We might stop doing something we like to do like shopping. These kinds of actions are helpful, but do we then focus on Christ's words and journey to his cross?

**Try this**: read one of the Gospels or more than one. Mark's Gospel reads like a newspaper article. One can read it in one sitting or just a few. Carry the thoughts you read in the Gospels with you throughout the Lenten Season. Pray daily.

I usually like to have a special study for Sunday School or midweek class during Lent. Since I arrived on the scene just a week ago, I have not had time to plan any Lenten study. I hope we can make some plans for next year's Lenten Season.

May each of you have a meaningful Lent as we travel towards Spring and the Resurrection celebration of Jesus Christ, our Savior.

### Meet Your new Church Secretary

I had the perfect job, the perfect wife, and the perfect future until the morning I woke to discover my whole left side was numb. I chalked it up to sleeping wrong, but stayed numb. Then it got really scary: I temporarily lost some of my vision and couldn't feel anything in my legs. I lost all feeling in my fingertips. The doctors diagnosed Multiple Sclerosis.

Multiple Sclerosis, or MS, is a disease that attacks the central nervous system, which is made up of the brain, spinal cord, and optic nerves. The progress, severity, and specific symptoms of MS are unpredictable. It is incurable.

I live in Hollidaysburg with my wife Lisa. My oldest son CJ lives in New York City and works for a huge internet marketing agency. My twin sons Kyle and Todd attend Penn College in Williamsport. Kyle is majoring in Horticulture and Todd is majoring in Graphic Design. Lisa is a Reading Specialist for the Hollidaysburg Area School District. We also have our two furry friends, Seuss our puppy and Rocco the wonder cat.

Besides my foundation I am involved in a great many activities including but not limited to: Grand Knight of Hollidaysburg, my churches Men's Club, Sound Operator for my church, Eagle Scout mentor, Producer/Box Office Manager for the Hollidaysburg Area Children's Theatre. Almighty God, giver of every good gift; look upon this congregation with grace. Guide the minds of our Call Committee members as they discern which of your servants will be our next pastor. Please grant that we might receive a faithful shepherd who will care for us and continue to equip us for ministry in this place. Through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.


