Greetings From The Pastor

A woman had moved to a new community and since she was an avid reader one of her first stops was the local library. She got her card and started visiting the library often. There was only one problem. She felt she was getting rude treatment from the Assistant Librarian. Finally, out of frustration she lodged a complaint with the head Librarian. The Librarian spoke to her Assistant and the next time the new-comer came into the library she was given the "royal" treatment.

It turns out that instead of scolding the Assistant for what was perceived to be bad behavior, the Librarian had told her how much the woman appreciated the great service she had been getting. The Assistant, with a new sense of appreciation, rose to the occasion, changed her attitude and began to render better service to all of her "customers."

Luther tells us that the 8th Commandment, "**You shall not bear false wit***ness*," is really about how we handle the truth we know about people. The Librarian could have told her Assistant what the woman really thought of her and caused a riff that might never have been resolved. Instead she chose to describe to the Assistant the kind of treatment the woman expected from her and, by so doing, converted a co-worker and created a friendship between two potential adversaries. Flattery may not always get us somewhere but it sure beats the alternative.

There is a line in the hymn, "Amazing Grace," that has always bothered me. "Amazing grace that saved a <u>wretch</u> like me." Jesus does not treat us like we are wretched people. He treats us as "saints in the making." As John 3:17 states: "God did not send his Son to condemn the world." Jesus came to help us reach our full potential. It is time for us to help one another in general, and St. James in particular, reach our full potential. GEBT NIEMALS AUF!
