# Greetings from The Pastor

## A RESSURECTION CHANGES EVERYTHING

When Jesus restored life to Lazarus he simple resuscitated him. Lazarus was the same man when he came out of the tomb that he was when he went in. Nothing had changed except that his old body with all its old organs were functioning as they were before. However, when Jesus came out of his tomb, everything about him was different. His body was no longer captive to a specific location. He could be in many places at the same time. His appearance was so different that his closest friends did not recognize him – until he spoke. What he had to say and the way he said it allowed his friends to recognize in an instant that he was the one who had so recently died and been buried.

St. James has a message for the community of Altoona and it is the same as it was on the day this congregation was founded over a hundred years ago. However, this congregation cannot deliver that message in the same "package" that it was using even fifty years ago. We need to be resurrected in the same sense that Jesus was resurrected. As I said in my Easter sermon, we need to come out of our tomb and look for more ways to address our message to more people. The message does not need to change but the delivery of that message does.

The challenge St. James faces today is probably the biggest challenge it has ever faced. The task is not for the faint hearted. But when we look at what God has done for us, dare we turn our back on the task before us. I am willing to give it my best effort and I am looking for more people willing to put their best effort into the cause.

# POT LUCK LUNCHEON MAY 4 - noon

As we look at the future of St. James it may be helpful to take a glance in the "rear view" mirror. The trend over the past decade does not speak well for our future.

In the fiscal year of 2004-05 the offering at St. James was \$69,812. To meet our financial obligations that year we dipped into savings and extracted \$48,528. In the fiscal year of 2012-13 the offering was \$39,060 and we dipped into our savings to the tune of \$87,000 dollars.

The average attendance in 2004-05 was 84. The average attendance in 2012-13 was 34.

In 2004-05 we needed \$118,340 to keep us going and in 2012-13 we needed 126,060.

In 2004-05 our offerings provided 59% of the financial support we needed. In 2012-13 our offerings provided 31% of the financial support we needed.

On April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2007 the total of our savings was \$1,407,631. On March 31, 2014 the total of our savings was \$793,792. Our "nest egg" shrunk by 44% in seven (7) years.

<u>If you are interested in the future of St. James</u> then please bring a casserole and join us for lunch following the service on May 4<sup>th</sup>. Pastor Ed and the Church Council are looking for any and all suggestions you may have.

Most Holy God, through your servant Moses you lead your people out of bondage in Egypt and by a star you guided the magi from the east to the birthplace of your Son. Direct this congregation as we look to the future. Remind us that you are with us and that you continue to guide us. We ask that you would lead a candidate to us who is eager to do ministry with us in this place and that you would lead us to recognize the one whom you send. We pray in the Name of Jesus Christ, who is the Good Shepherd. Amen.

# News & Notes From Council

- —A council meeting was held on April 8, 2014.
- —The agenda was adopted as presented.
- —A brainstorming session was held regarding the future of St. James.
- —The Council Minutes from the previous meeting were adopted as presented.
- —The Pastor's report was submitted, discussed, and accepted.
- —The investment reports were not available due to the early date of the meeting.
- —The church directory fund had an account balance of \$185 as of 3/31/14.
- —The special music fund had an account balance of \$155 as of 3/31/14.
- —All banking/investment accounts have been updated with new signers or will be updated within a week of the meeting.
- —The Treasurer's report was accepted.
- —An announcement for offering counters was requested as well as a meeting to learn the method used for counting and possible simplification of that method.
- —Elizabeth Richards will contact Kooman & Associates regarding notifications of a class action lawsuit and investments.
- —Interviews were scheduled for treasurer candidates.
- —It was reported that the potluck luncheon and hymn sing was well attended.
- —Organization for the church picnic is progressing well. Most jobs have at least one volunteer.
- —Planning for the summer day camp program in cooperation with Bethany and St. Luke's is underway. Cost per congregation is \$275.
- —A motion was made, seconded, and carried to pay the \$275 that is St. James' cost for the summer day camp.
- —Bill Dambeck reported that he is attempting to meet with Mark Rispoli to look over the parish house roof and get an estimate on repairs.

- —A meeting to plan the clean-out project will be scheduled for sometime after Easter. It was noted that the deadline for people to retrieve items they have donated is April 30.
- —A congregation member has offered to cover the costs of a letter to all members in order to update church records.
- —Procedure to pay any future guest musicians was discussed, but nothing was decided at this time.
- —A possible summer music program was mentioned.
- —Edith Trinks has agreed to be the third member of the by-laws committee.
- —Approximately one dozen names were submitted for consideration for a Call Committee.
- —St. James still needs volunteers for Synod Assembly delegates.
- —A letter will be sent to the Platinum Steppers. This letter will be in regard to ending their use of St. James at the end of May.
- —The Good Samaritan funds for the Hollidaysburg Fire Victims will be forwarded.




