MISSION STATEMENT:

My friends who are campers tell me that in the wilderness short-term strategies are needed to ensure long-term survival. They tell me that each day is critical and time cannot be wasted. In the wilderness you need a good map, a lot of trust, a willingness to put up with the nervousness of people who are on the trail for the first time and, above all, the help of a good guide.

The guide for a congregation in transition, such as St. James, is the Intentional Interim Minister which is yours truly. Sitting around the campfire with your congregation, I am here to be your pastor: to perform weddings and funerals, to administer the sacraments, to give pastoral counsel and care, to tend to the administration of the church and to faithfully preach and teach the word of God. I trust that I am serving for you in this way.

But there are five stories the I need to help you discover: the story of your own history; the story of your denominational family; the story of leadership; the story of mission and vision; and the story of your next pastor, which is the story whose ending is yet to be written. I will outline one format for the hearing the story of your own history.

The first story to be told is always that of the congregation's own history. Each pastor's term in a congregation is a chapter in a congregation's history and is unique unto itself. The longer the chapter, the more history there is to describe.

Our congregational council will have a retreat in September, date to be determined, at which we will begin to share some of the history of St.James such as names, dates and events that members feel were important. This will include times we want to remember and find a way to also share the things that we may wish to forget.

These things are not to be judgements of any pastor or member, but to share what experiences had a significant impact on each member, the congregation and the ministry of St. James. The hope is that we can begin the process of affirming what is good and meaningful at St. James and what needs to be let go as part of the past. Council will share what they believe is important for you to hear. My hope is that we might include as many members as possible in sharing the history in the weeks ahead. Often our reaction to change is to feel a sense of loss; we think about what has gone away, not about

what is coming. And if we focus on what was, we become caught up in the past and not focusing on the present and future that the Lord is calling us.

If you would like to attend the council retreat that will be less than one day and held at St. James, please let me or Mark Hoover know.

Blessings to us all as we continue to strengthen our ministry together with our Lord Jesus Christ. May we have a wonderful coming together in this new season.

ST. JAMES LUTHERAN CHURCH CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING AUGUST 11, 2015 AT 6:00PM

PASTORS' REPORT: Pastor Jim reported on continued visitations.

He gave a report on leading the worship service at the Lutheran Home in Hollidaysburg and was pleased with the large attendance.

He plans to attend the PSU outreach on campus on August 27th from 2-4pm. Hopes are that the outreach will attract some of the college students to join us in any number of ministries or service.

He recently did a house blessing for the Manbeck's.

Pastor reported on the success of the music camp and thanked all those involved. He also mentioned that the church has collected \$370.35 for the backpack program for kids associated with the music camp,

Pastor will be attending the Bishop's Convocation in September.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Council members looked over the report and had no questions. Louisa Marshall made a motion to accept. Donna Foster seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Discussion took place on reimbursement for the gift cards Pastor purchased for the musicians that participated in the music camp. Ralph will be handling this from the proper fund.

FINANCE: An email and phone calls were made to committee members with 3 possible dates for a meeting with Kooman Associates. When all have replied to Mark and a consensus is made the meeting will be scheduled.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION/SOCIAL MINISTRY: Our Pot Luck Dinner will be held Sunday August 23rd, with the next one scheduled for September 20th. For the August date Evelyn will be looking into pricing for Ox Roast from Holland Brothers, depending on the pricing it will be decided whether or not to provide the meat or just have everyone just bring a dish. The Octoberfest committee will meet Sunday August 16th. Ideas and people are still needed. A number of council members volunteered to help in many ways. Ralph will be checking into the music endowment fund to see if funds can be used for music for the event. Discussion took place on opening Octoberfest to the public, reservations, charging for admission and advertising in the Altoona Mirror religious notes section. This will all be discussed at their upcoming meeting.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE: Bill Dambeck acquired a quote on the repointing of the mortar on the office portion of the church facing Stevens Mortuary to prevent further damage to the building, as well as the chimney on the church. Approval to continue is still needed once council has some questions answered.

STEWARDSHIP/EVANGELISM COMMITEE: No report. They will meet in the fall.

WORSHIP AND MUSIC COMMITTEE: This committee is in need of a chair person. Pat McConnell talked to all members by phone, Hymns are picked through November, and choir start date practice is set for September 3rd, with singing for service starting September 6th. We need to know date for Harvest Home Sunday (if having one) and if we are involved in October-fest/date.

The pipe organ repairs will be completed in the fall once the weather changes.

MUTUAL MINISTRY COMMITTEE: A meeting was scheduled for August 16th but needs to be rescheduled. Pastor Jim will be setting up the meeting.

BY-LAWS COMMITTEE: It was reported that the By-Laws are complete but need to be inputted into the computer, printed for the members to re-read for final approval. A meeting will be set for fall.

OLD BUSINESS: Pastor Jim suggested the council retreat brought up at the last council meeting take place September 27th after service. Retreat to be completed by 4pm. A motion to accept the date was made by Evelyn Holsinger and seconded by Donna Wilt. The motion carried. The old laptop has been setup and in use for Ralph Grove. The silk flower arrangements are still in the works. Mark was not available to give us an update on the MP3 recorder, to be utilized to record Pastor's sermons for the webpage. Music camp was mentioned again with nothing but good comments.

NEW BUSINESS: Pastor will be composing another letter to be sent out to the entire congregation encouraging them to return to worship and attend Octoberfest. Once release forms are obtained from those featured in the Music Camp DVD, Tim will be editing it to feature key moments for our church website. The proposal for \$3,000 of concrete/pointing work for the church was discussed but still requires more information before approval can be given to proceed. The scholarship program that was advertised in the bulletin was discussed and council had decided back in the fall of 2014 that this program would be suspended for 2015 but the information was not passed on to the new administrative assistant resulting in an error in advertising. Council decided that Mark Hoover would send letters of explanation and apologizes to those that applied. A request was made by the youth group chairperson on how much money is in the account and would like more information on how this money is to be utilized. Pastor Jim distributed a handout on a new group his wife Tere would like to start on women's issues that would meet at St. James every Tuesday from 11:30-1:30, beginning September 1st. There will be NO cost to the church. They will be running a 3 month trial period to see how accepted and successful the program is. Betty Boslet made a motion to allow the program to run at St, James, Donna Wilt seconded. Motion carried.

MEETING ADJOURNMENT: Debra Morgan made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Betty Boslet seconded the motions. The motion carried. Council voted by standing.

The Meeting adjourned at 7:40 PM with the Lord's Prayer.

A prayer for uncertain times

An hour before the 9/11 terrorist attacks, pastor and author Stan Purdum was reading Psalm 66, which includes the words, "We went through fire and through water; yet you have brought us out to a spacious place" (v. 12, NRSV). After watching the destruction, Purdum composed a prayer that remains relevant today, as terrorism and threats often make peace seem more "specious" than "spacious":

O God of heaven and earth, who's bigger than nations and factions, be with us as we live through times of terror, despair and danger. Be the strength of people who've been touched personally by disaster. Come with healing to those who are injured. Be the eternal rest of those who've died.
