# Greetings from The Pastor

It was a tricky move on my part but it was a deliberate move designed to remind us that when it comes to the future of St. James we all have a part to play.

My sermon on Jan. 19<sup>th</sup> was based on a passage from Isaiah. In that passage Isaiah details the job description God had outlined for him as a Prophet of Israel. Israel, like St. James, was in a struggle for its survival. Isaiah describes his job with these words: **BRING BACK – GATHER – RAISE UP – RESTORE.** During the sermon I asked the congregation if that sounded like a job description for the "minister" at St. James and they agreed that it did.

So we agreed that a minister at St. James has the same responsibility that Isaiah had, i.e., to **BRING BACK – GATHER – RAISE UP – RE-STORE**. But what I then pointed out to the congregation was the fact that each week our bulletin states that the **MINISTERS** at St. James are the **PEOPLE OF ST. JAMES**. Incidentally, most of the congregations I have visited in the past decades have a similar statement in their bulletins. The whole truth is that the **MINISTERS** responsible for the rebuilding of this congregation are the "**PEOPLE**" of St. James. Isaiah probably felt he had no help in rebuilding Israel. I optimistically believe I have more help. **Gebt Niemals Auf!**

# From The Desk Of ELCA Bishop, Elizabeth A. Eaton

We do many wonderful and important things together as the <u>ELCA</u>. We alleviate hunger, we're stopping malaria, we give voice to the most vulnerable in our society, we shelter the homeless, we heal the sick, we rebuild communities after disaster strikes, we work for justice. I am not suggesting that we stop doing any of this. But we must be clear that we are church first. We aren't a non-governmental organization. We aren't the government. We aren't the American Cancer Society.

Baptism makes a difference and makes us different. We are in Christ. Baptism means the death of our old self. This implies sacrifice. It should also mean that we as church do not fit in with the surrounding culture. There are many socially conscious, kindhearted, generous, morally upright, compassionate atheists in the world. How are we distinguishable from them? If our

life together consists primarily of being affirmed by God's unconditional love and doing works of justice and charity without understanding that God has brought about the transformation of justified sinners through the costly grace of the crucified Christ, then we are not church.

How are we to live as church first? This is how I see it. At the center of our life together is worship and at the center of our worship is the crucified and risen Christ. When we gather for worship we turn our gaze away from ourselves to the source of our life and hope and salvation. When we gather for worship we are encountered by the living God in Scripture, proclamation of the gospel and the sacraments. God meets us and transforms us. We taste, touch and see the love of God in Christ. Sinners are forgiven. Freed from the incessant human striving for self-justification we can be "lost in wonder, love and praise" (Evangelical Lutheran Worship, 631).

We are church first. All of our work flows from this. Let's keep the main thing the main thing.
