GIVING THANKS - - - - - THANKS GIVING

"Each one must give as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." II Corinthians. 9:7 (RSV)

- People give to people, not to budgets.
- People give to people when they are invited to give by people they trust.
- People give to people who ask for a gift for a specific mission.
- People give when they feel that they have participated in the choice of the cause.
- People give when they can see that the gift directly helps people.
- People give out of generosity, not from what they can afford to give.

People give the way they live, sometimes informal and spontaneous, not formal and planned.

- People resist giving when pushed to give in a way that does not match the way they live.
- People do not give generously out of obligation.
- People resist giving when they do not feel they have really participated in the choice of the cause. People are less generous when there are no compelling "people pictures."

Spontaneous Giving

Many acts of generosity and charity happen on impulse. Someone identifies a worthwhile cause. The person sharing the invitation has the mutual trust, respect, credibility, and confidence of the congregation. The invitation touches people's compassion and they give generously.

Seasonal Giving

People give in relation to how they receive their income. When people received their cash in little brown envelopes each week the weekly church envelope was invented. The period from Thanksgiving through Christmas, with its spirit of giving, is a seasonal pattern. Lent is a season that traditionally lends itself to "self denial" giving.

OUR GIVING THANKS AND THANKS GIVING is our response to God's love for us. The ministry of Christ's church relies on our thanks giving for God's love to be known to our congregation, the larger church and the world. As we GIVE THANKS this THANKSGIVING, let us consider our THANKS GIVING for Christ's ministry through our church.

Dear Friends,

Many of us have seen the devastation caused by the flooding in South Carolina (SC). I invite you to join me in responding. Bishop Herman Yoos of the SC Synod has told us that the best way to respond right now is by financially supporting the emergency response work being done through Lutheran Disaster Response and through the SC Synod Office.

I am asking all the congregations of the Allegheny Synod to AT LEAST one Sunday between now and November 22 (Christ the King Sunday) take up a special offering for Flood Relief in SC. You may want to do this once, or, you may decide to do a continual gathering of funds to help our sisters and brothers in need. I would also ask you to report what you gather to Michelle in the Synod Office, so we can have an idea of what we are able to do when our Synod works together.

Many of you have connections to SC. It is a popular vacation spot, many of us have friends and family who live there, there are many Lutherans, and some of us did our Seminary and internship in these very communities that have been flooded. We have lots of connections. Let us take the time to respond and help our sisters and brothers in need.

Thank you for your consideration. We are also in dialogue with colleagues in South Carolina about brining mission teams down to help assist with the cleanup. The folks on the scene in SC (the Synod Office and Emergency Services) have instructed us that the best thing to do now is Wait. Once emergency management services are able to get in and fully understand the extent of the damage they will begin to call for volunteers. That call should begin by the end of the month, but will continue well into next year. We will keep you informed as plans are made for groups to go south to help with the cleanup effort.

Thankful Hearts


Make table decorations that serve as Thanksgiving conversation-starters.

What you need:

- Paper and pencil
- Scissors
- Cloth or felt
- Needle and thread
- Sewing machine (optional)
 Fiber fill, cotton balls
- or rice • Adult help

What you do:

- Cut out a heart pattern (any size) on paper. Allow 1/4" for a seam if you'll be using a sewing machine.
- 2. Cut out material hearts, placing pieces right sides out if sewing by hand and right sides together if using a machine.
- 3. For hand-sewing, use a running stitch or an overcast stitch. Leave an opening for stuffing.
- 4. With a machine, sew along a 1/4" seam, allowing a 1" opening so you can turn the heart inside out and insert stuffing. Trim close to seam but don't cut stitching.
- 5. Fill with stuffing. Sew the opening shut by hand.
- 6. Put a heart at each place setting. Before dinner, have guests pick theirs up and say why they have a thankful heart.



Candidacy is the process of discernment and preparation leading individuals to approval for public ministries of the ELCA and

participation as leaders in the work God in this Church. The staff of the Allegheny Synod administers the candidacy process through the ELCA. Persons who sense a call to the ministry of Word and Service or the ministry of Word and Sacrament enter the candidacy process through our Synod's Office of the Bishop. A committee of dedicated lay and rostered leaders meet with and follow candidates through the process until they are assigned and able to receive a call.
