

PASTOR'S LETTER FOR OCTOBER 2016





Autumn brings obvious change in the natural world that surrounds us. It is a bright, beautiful, color-ful change as the rich green foliage in these Pennsylvania mountain forests turns to brilliant reds, oranges, and yellows—all signs that winter is soon coming. The daylight grows shorter and the temperatures grow cooler. But this change also brings a certain ambivalence—a reluctance to give up the warm sun of summer days, yet at the same time and anticipations of the first snowfall and the quiet hush of winter. All life seems patterned to the changing seasons...patterned, somewhat cyclical, yet ever changing. The changing seasons remind us that nothing is permanent in this life. Change itself is the only constant.

The world around us is changing at a phenomenal rate, like never before in human history. It has become very difficult to keep up with technological changes in our culture. Just when you get a certain type of cell phone, a new and better one comes out. Constant updates are sent across the internet for us to download into our devices and computers. Products change. Just when we find one kind of laundry soap we like, for example, a new and "improved" version of it comes out. There is a constant influx of new products on the market. A favorite store closes and another opens. The world seems in constant flux.

People change too. Children grow up and leave home for college or trade school or the military or for a job somewhere else. And we adults grow older. A glance in the mirror reveals more grey or white hairs and wrinkles on the outside that only reflect a year more of life's experiences and the changes that go with those experiences. We never stop growing and changing.

Amidst all this change, we may look to our church to give us some stability. We may hope that our church is just one secure place where we can go and things remain the same. But there we find changes too. A change in pastors, a new worship book in the pews, new hymns, new liturgies, new faces, new events...nothing seems permanent in this world, and our need for stability gets more and more difficult to satisfy.

Consider this quote from King Whitney Jr.: "Change has a considerable psychological impact on the human mind. To the fearful it is threatening because it means that things may get worse. To the hopeful it is encouraging because things may get better. To the confident it is inspiring because the challenge exists to make things better."

So consider this question: Are the better days of St. James behind us or before us? To be sure, St. James has had some very good days in the past. This congregation has a marvelous history! Yet as we continue to grow together as disciples of Jesus Christ, we can have the faith that *always* there are better days yet to come! And as your new pastors, Pastor Scott and I look forward to these days to come!

Still, as we work together to proclaim Jesus Christ in this ever changing world it is a blessing to know that God is *un*changing. And it is a comfort to hear these words from scripture: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." (Hebrews 13:8) God bless. See you in church!



Sunday - Sept. 11, 2016

"Blessed are the Peacemakers, for they will be called children of God"

– Jesus Christ (Matt. 5:9)
