PENTECOST SEASON

Pentecost Sunday, May 15, 2016



How much joy do we experience at church? We feel hope at a baptism. The music can fill our souls. The fellowship of other Christians sustains us. A word from God can either comfort or confront us. How much frustration do we experience at church? We are concerned about the bills and the giving. Meetings may seem to take forever. People disappoint us.



If we look at the larger picture, church attendance is OK, but we wish it were better. Why don't former members return to our congregation? Our synod and national church leaders struggle to help the church with decreasing resources and a drastically changed society.

We find church a place of nurture, but also a place of struggle. We experience church as both joy and burden. Our critics have it right: We do find hypocrites in church. But so did Paul, way back when.

We should not turn a blind eye to the problems of the church, but we shouldn't give up in despair either. The church sets aside the day of Pentecost and the Pentecost season to celebrate what it considers its birth, as told in the Book of Acts.

We rejoice that after producing his gospel, Luke continued his writing and composed the book of Acts. He helps us understand the mission of the church. Should we still consider ourselves as waiting for an act of power and glory that we might experience as on that first Pentecost?

When we read that the Holy Spirit came at Pentecost with "a sound like the rush of a violent wind," we get the impression of uncontrollable power. Just as the wind can blow gently, or with such force that it knocks us down, the Spirit can gently comfort us or move us to places we never thought we would go. How different the rush of power at Pentecost seems from the struggles of the church and our congregation today.

We could use a stiff breeze, even if it knocked us over, to pump some energy into us, to unleash the power for good that we might wield. We could use a wind that would blow away our complacency, a wind that would pick us up and would fill us with God's Spirit in Christ. During the coming Pentecost Season, pick up your Bible and read the Book of Acts.

COME on Pentecost Sunday and pray with us for God's Spirit to fill each of our lives and our mission and ministry together at St. James.

News and Notes from Council

ST. JAMES EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING
April 12, 2016 AT 6:00PM

DEVOTIONS: A prayer was offered by Pastor Jim.

CHURCH MINUTES: Minutes from March 8, 2016 were read and approved.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor gave an update on the condition of Deb Morgan. New Members will be received on May 8th. A short reception following worship was suggested. The Synod Assembly has been changed to only 2 days. June 3rd and 4th. Pastor Jim introduced the Mission Profile Statement to plan for the future of St James. A Call Committee will need to be established and a separate meeting with Pastor Paula to get the process started. Betty Boslet made a motion to accept the Pastor's Report and Donna Foster seconded the motion. Motion carried.

TREASURE'S REPORT: Ralph presented his reports, with all details. Betty Boslet made a motion to accept. Donna Foster seconded the motion. The motion carried.

FINANCE COMMITTEE: Future meeting with Kooman Associates is being planned.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION/SOCIAL MINISTRY: The next Pot Luck Dinner will be changed from May 15th to May 22nd. A motion was made by Betty Boslet to accept this change and Evelyn Holsinger seconded the motion. Motion carried.

St James will be hosting the Allegheny Chorale Sunday May 1st. At least 3 dozen cookies will be needed. A meeting needs to be scheduled for this committee.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE: A sign is still needed for the Handicap Entrance. Still working on a lighting solution for going into the Janitor's Room. Still need to look into the lighting in the sanctuary. Still looking into a motion light is needed for the office entrance. Looking into a boiler for hot water heat for the sanctuary. Bob Holsinger Jr and his father will begin the process when Bob Sr returns from Florida. Either new fluorescent tubes or a ballast needs replaced in the church office. A new chairperson is still needed. A meeting needs to take place to discuss these issues.

WORSHIP AND MUSIC COMMITTEE: Ralph Grove gave a report on the tuning of the pipe organ and the remaining issues that need addressed. The idea of a Hand Bell Choir is still being investigated. Contemporary Service. This is essentially put on hold until the Mission Plan is completed. Pastor Jim and Mark Hoover will still continue to gather information.

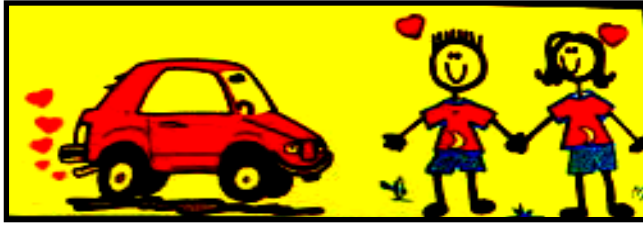

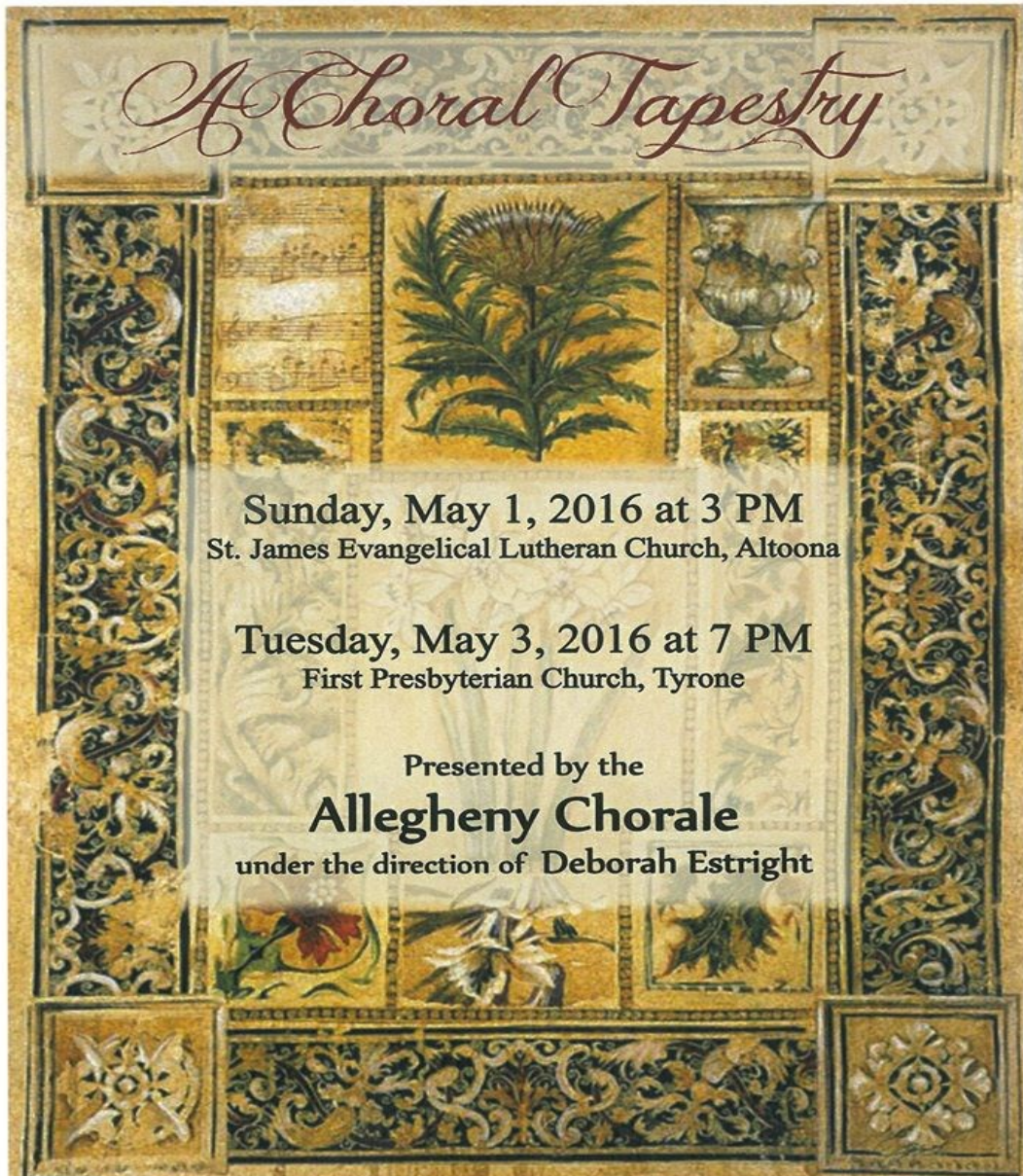
