# PASTOR'S LETTER FOR August 2018





As I write this newsletter article Pastor Carol and I are planning a trip to northern Minnesota. We are going with our son for a few days to see some of the vacation sights of his childhood and to visit the graves of Carol's parents. In October my nephew's wedding will have us visiting Los Angeles, and while we are there we will visit the graves of my parents and sister. I grew up far away from any relatives, and I now live far from my childhood home. This means that visiting graveyards was not something I have done very often.

Of course, that does not mean that I am a stranger to the places. My ministry has put me beside graves hundreds of times. I could write a review column for the newspaper on the cemeteries of this area of Pennsylvania. I am very familiar with them.

However, visiting the grave of a loved one is not the same as simply being in a cemetery. I have only been to my parents' and sister's graves once since my mother and sister died. That visit was a hurried affair during a vacation with our son's family. These upcoming visits will be much more intentional.

Do you take flowers? Talk to the deceased? Sit quietly and pray? Have a picnic? I am not sure what I will or should do. If I had grown up visiting cemeteries regularly with my parents, I would have inherited some sort of ritual. That would be helpful. I, however, did not, so I am on my own to make sense of it all.

I know that God will be present when I visit. I know that the promises of the resurrection remain true and powerful. It still, however, will no doubt be a somber and confusing experience. Grief is a complex emotion. I don't have to have it all worked out. I will simply go, and trust that the Spirit is present. Thankfully Carol and I have each other to offer companionship. I also know that as my sisters and brothers in Christ read this article they will offer a prayer. It is enough.

# Saint James the Apostle's Story

# Saint of the Day for July 25

This James is the brother of John the Evangelist. The two were called by Jesus as they worked with their father in a fishing boat on the Sea of Galilee. Jesus had already called another pair of brothers from a similar occupation: Peter and Andrew. "He walked along a little farther and saw James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They too were in a boat mending their nets. Then he called them. So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him" (Mark 1:19-20).

James was one of the favored three who had the privilege of witnessing the Transfiguration, the raising to life of the daughter of Jairus, and the agony in Gethsemani.

Two incidents in the Gospels describe the temperament of this man and his brother. Saint Matthew tells that their mother came—Mark says it was the brothers themselves—to ask that they have the seats of honor in the kingdom. "Jesus said in reply, 'You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I am going to drink?' They said to him, 'We can'" (Matthew 20:22). Jesus then told them they would indeed drink the cup and share his baptism of pain and death, but that sitting at his right hand or left was not his to give—it "is for those for whom it has been prepared by my Father" (Matthew 20:23b). It remained to be seen how long it would take to realize the implications of their confident "We can!"

The other disciples became indignant at the ambition of James and John. Then Jesus taught them all the lesson of humble service: The purpose of authority is to serve. They are not to impose their will on others, or lord it over them. This is the position of Jesus himself. He was the servant of all; the service imposed on him was the supreme sacrifice of his own life.

On another occasion, James and John gave evidence that the nickname Jesus gave them—"sons of thunder"—was an apt one. The Samaritans would not welcome Jesus because he was on his way to hated Jerusalem. "When the disciples James and John saw this they asked, 'Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?' Jesus turned and rebuked them..." (Luke 9:54-55).

James was apparently the first of the apostles to be martyred. "About that time King Herod laid hands upon some members of the church to harm them. He had James, the brother of John, killed by the sword, and when he saw that this was pleasing to the Jews he proceeded to arrest Peter also" (Acts 12:1-3a).

This James, sometimes called James the Greater, is not to be confused with James the Lesser or with the author of the *Letter of James* and the leader of the Jerusalem community.

Heavenly Father, draw us into fellowship with You and with one another, with Your Son at the center. Amen

Aug 7—Acts 3:11-16, Psalm 110

Father in heaven, grant us repentant hearts that we may hear the message of the Author of Life. Amen

Aug 8-Acts 3:17-26, Psalm 1

Heavenly Father, grant us faith in the Word and Sacraments that bring us Your Son on Your terms. Amen

Aug 9—Acts 4:5-12, Psalm 27

Lord Jesus, we cannot save ourselves, but we trust in You. We know that You'll not fail us. Amen

Aug 10-Acts 5:27-32, Psalm 119:49-64

Father in heaven, may our trust in Your Son be unwavering. Amen

Aug 11—Acts 6:1-6, Psalm 86

Lord Jesus, bless everyone called to serve in Your Church, so that no people do their work by their own strength, but instead by the power of Your Holy Spirit. Amen


