## PASTOR'S LETTER FOR September 2018





It was 41 years ago, in September of 1977, that I moved from Minnesota to Berkeley, California to begin seminary at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary. I had chosen that seminary in California for several reasons—reasons that outweighed the one fear I had about moving there...I was afraid that there might be a bad earthquake! I was recalling all this lately. And I was also remembering that in September of 2011, when we were living in the Johnstown area, there was a magnitude 5.8 earthquake that rattled the East Coast!

"Did you feel the quake?" That was the question of the day on the day after that small earthquake hit. I did not feel it. Apparently I was out in the hallway of Mt. Calvary with our administrative assistant talking about the new Sunday School curriculum. But secretary felt it—she was sitting at her desk in the office. And Pastor Scott felt it. He was making a visit on the 8<sup>th</sup> floor of hospital in Johnstown. He called me shortly after from his cell to say that he had felt an earthquake right there in Johnstown!

Of course, Pastor Scott knows all too well what earthquakes are about, having grown up in L.A. He lived through two really bad ones when he was growing up there. He can tell you about the morning in 1971 that his mother, sister and he ducked under the kitchen counter and watched the gas stove bounce around. Later they were evacuated because the dam above the valley was weakened and might break. He has a typical Californian instinct to take cover the moment he feels the floor shake—although here, it is usually only a heavy truck driving by.

As he was reading the headlines in the Johnstown Tribune the morning after the quake in 2011, he joked, "People in the East have 'earthquake envy'. A little moderate shaker and they all want earthquake survivor badges!" He said this with a wry smile. But then I have to admit, I do have "earthquake envy". Now don't get me wrong—I only want to feel a little shake...none of the 7.8 or 9.2 ones for me.

But you would think that after having lived in the San Francisco Bay area for three years while in seminary, I would have felt at least one *small* earthquake! After all, we were told that Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary was built right on top of a large fault line. But, woe is me, I never felt one. Oh, why couldn't it have been me who made the hospital visits that day in Johnstown?

But seriously, I do know that earthquakes can be very frightening, and harmful. Scott's father described the one that hit in 1994 as he was walking down the hall one morning in their L.A. home. They were very near the epicenter, and the wave hit their house right at the peak. He said that the floor beneath him suddenly raised a couple of feet and then dropped again. Sadly, as a result of that trauma, he suffered a heart attack hours later—one that damaged his heart permanently and changed the way he needed to live until he died a few years later.

I cannot imagine what it must be like to feel the earth move under your feet. I would think that it would be very disturbing. I have seen tornadoes where I grew up, and here in the East we have experienced the remains of hurricanes blowing through, and although that is scary, at least those are predicted and you can be prepared. But earthquakes are unpredictable. And the one thing we like to assume to be true is the certainly that the earth is solid beneath us...until we feel the shake of a quake like that one in 2011.

The truth is, "God is our [only] refuge and strength...a very present help in times of trouble. Therefore we will not fear though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though...the mountains tremble with its tumult...The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge." [Psalm 46] Of this we can be certain! May we all grow together in this firm faith and assurance. See you in church!


