## PASTOR'S LETTER FOR May 2019





There are so many things I could share about our recent travels in Australia...the kangaroos, wallabies, colorful birds, and koalas; the Outback experiences and snorkeling along the Great Barrier Reef; the various aboriginal people we met, touring in Melbourne and Sydney (worshiping on our last Sunday at St. James Church—Anglican)! But during the Easter Season, as I reflect on the Resurrection of Christ and how that event has given us the promise of our personal resurrection in Christ, I cannot help but think of all the time changes we went through on our trip!

First we lost a day on our flight from L.A. to Melbourne as we crossed over the International Dateline, plus we had to set our watches forward by 15 hours! Then when we flew to the Outback we had to set our watches back a half-hour...perhaps the only place in the world that has a time zone that is half an hour different! Then when as we flew to Cairns on the East Coast we set our watches ahead an hour and a half. Now we were in the same time zone there as Sydney so we didn't have to change our watches on the flight from there to Sydney, but during our days in Sydney they went off of Daylight Savings Time, so we had to set our watches back as hour that night! Then on the flight back we set our watches 18 hours back, plus we regained the day we had lost as we crossed over the International Dateline again!

Are you confused? Believe me, so were we! Time is a fascinating part of God's Creation! But what about the passing of time from God's perspective? What will the passing of time be like in the resurrection? I believe that we may find some insights into this if we look at the creation story in Genesis 1:3-5... "And there was evening, and there was morning, the first day." Could it be that where God exists in Heaven there is no passing of time? And when we pass with Jesus into our joyful resurrection perhaps we will experience no passing of time?

In the meantime, as we celebrate the joy of Christ's Resurrection during these 50 days of the Easter Season, may we all enjoy the extra daylight of spring! Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed! Alleluia!

## Easter 2019

Sisters and Brothers,

May God's grace and peace be with you as we celebrate the great victory of God in Jesus Christ our Lord. On Easter Sunday, we celebrate that our Lord Jesus Christ has defeated the powers of sin, death, and the devil by opening the way for you and me to be brought into his eternal life.

We celebrate that in Jesus we receive the great gift of salvation, a gift that is poured into us through the grace and mercy of almighty God. We proclaim today that, "Christ is Risen, He is Risen Indeed!" and we rejoice that because he is risen we too shall rise. Thanks be to God!

There is something interesting about our Easter gospel reading, Luke 24:1–12. You might have noticed on the day we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus doesn't actually show up in this reading or chapter. We might think this strange. The whole story of the gospel has been building up to this great victory of the resurrection, but when the resurrection occurs in Luke, we don't see Jesus because this account is about the mission of Jesus Christ and how he is calling us into his life.

When we read on, we find Jesus in chapter 25 where he appears to the two disciples on the Road to Emmaus. The risen Lord is not hanging around the tomb waiting to be discovered. The risen Jesus has work to do and he is immediately out on the road looking for his people and bringing them the good news of his resurrection.

I always find this a very poignant moment in the gospel—the first time we see the resurrected Jesus in Luke we see him on the road seeking out his people. When he walks with the disciples on the road to Emmaus, he is teaching them, comforting them, and eventually he will feed them.

Had we been betrayed, abandoned, mocked, beaten, and wrongfully killed, our first reaction upon resurrection would most likely not be mercy, grace, and forgiveness but rather anger and perhaps even seeking vengeance. Our Lord Jesus reaches out in love to those who betrayed him and brings salvation to the world that tried to destroy him. This is the true love and mercy of our Lord and our God.

That same Jesus is the one who is with us now. We follow the Jesus who comes after us and seeks us out. Our Lord is continually calling and welcoming us to him. This Jesus also sent the Holy Spirit to do that continual work of pursuing us and bringing us back to our life with God and with our Lord Jesus.

This Easter we thank God for the victory of Christ Jesus—the one who is always calling, inviting, and looking for us. Jesus loves you so much. He doesn't give up on you or me--ever. He always welcomes us into his life and invites us to walk with him.

May you know the presence of Jesus Christ who is with you now and always.
