# PASTOR'S LETTER FOR August 2019





Something is wrong with my foot. I don't know what, but it hurts. I went to the urgent care clinic, and they took an x-ray. They couldn't find anything and referred me to University Orthopedics, and am waiting to see the doctor there. I don't know what they will find, and I don't know what they will suggest I do.

I started this process at 10:15 by walking in to the clinic. I got registered, saw the physician, had an x-ray taken, saw the physician again, and got my referral sent over. I walked out the door by 11:15. The whole time everyone kept apologizing for taking so long.

I then grabbed a quick sandwich and headed over to University Orthopedics. Of course, I had no appointment. I walked in at about 11:40. I waited a minute or two behind a couple of people in the registration line. When I got up to the desk, the person took my name, the referral form, and x-rays. She then went into the back room.

She reappeared in about 3 minutes and told me that they only had one foot specialist in today. This physician, she explained, was at the hospital at the moment and could see me, but not until 2:00. I smiled and said that was great.

I was taken back the receptionist response. She let out a breath, and said that she was glad I was okay with that. I responded that I really did not expect that an orthopedic surgeon was going to be sitting there waiting for me to show up unannounced today. She said that many people really get mad and the last couple of weeks people have been really short tempered.

I am now at home writing this article as I await the time for me to head back over to University Orthopedics. I thought I could use the time to write an article for the newsletter. This is that article, and it simply raises a question. Have we gotten so impatient and demanding that anyone would find my experience so far today as anything other than amazingly responsive.

Remember I have had no appointments. I have been left waiting no more than five or ten minutes anywhere. Maybe the whole thing will derail, and I will be ranting and raving as I head to bed tonight. However, have we as a people reached a point where receptionists are afraid of the people who come to their desk even when everything is going well.

Tattoos are a big deal lately. Maybe we all need to get the golden rule tattooed on the inside of our eye lids. Maybe we all need to be reminded to treat each other with grace. Especially we would do well to treat those receptionists, clerks, secretaries, bank tellers, waitresses, nurses... you know, all those who deal daily with the "public"... with some basic kindness. Apparently they are having a hard time of it.
