# PASTOR'S LETTER FOR September 2019





I once noticed a poster in a church hallway. It said, "Few things in life can be relied on like faith." I personally know this to be true, especially when hardship and trials come our way. But how do we pass Christian faith on to others in such a way that they will make it their own? We can teach them about faith, but that does not necessarily place faith into their hearts! Passing faith on to others is ultimately the work of the Holy Spirit. Faith is caught, not taught. But we must do our part as servants of the Spirit, and we must do our best! And attendance at weekly worship is a really good start!

It would be difficult to over-estimate the importance of Sunday worship attendance as a routine in a our lives, and all the more so today as we experience countless pressures to engage in behaviors that can be harmful—even destructive—to our lives! Being in the presence of the fellowship of believers is the way to help us "catch" and "re-catch" the faith.

It would also be difficult to over-estimate the importance of frequent Bible reading along with worship attendance as a routine in everyone's life! The culture that surrounds us today is very different than the one that most of us grew up in.

Participation in the faith-based activities of our church is actually now considered a *counter*-cultural activity!

We all need the "re-fueling" for our faith that worship and frequent Bible reading opportunities bring. We always did, but all the more so today! And we never stop growing in our faith! Being in the presence of the fellowship of believers is the way to help us keep "catching" the faith and growing together as disciples of Jesus Christ
