
Merciful God.

²²The same night [Jacob] got up and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. ²³He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had. ²⁴Jacob was left alone; and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. ²⁵When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket; and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. ²⁶Then he said, "Let me go, for the day is breaking." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go, unless you bless me." ²⁷So he said to him, "What is your name?" 

MODERN DAY GLEANING

In the biblical book of Ruth, Ruth and her mother-in-law, Naomi, are widows during a famine. In those times, there were customary provisions for widows and the poor to ensure they had adequate food. They were allowed to "glean" from the fields, meaning they could gather the extra abundance following a harvest at no cost to them.

Boaz, one of Naomi's relatives, allowed Ruth to glean from his fields and ordered workers to make sure to leave enough barley behind so that she and Naomi would be well fed.
