### PASTOR'S LETTER FOR November 2019





As you may know, we spend four of our days each week providing day care for two of our grandsons. One is about two and a half. The other is about 9 months. I actually go over at eight o'clock each morning to get them both ready for the day and their older brother off to school.

As you can imagine, this is a great deal of work. It does not leave a great deal of time to take care of the basic business of life. Going to the doctor, grocery shopping, bill paying, car maintenance... these things get pushed into the one day we have off or left crowded into nap time. A constant prayer in our house is "let them stay asleep."

But on the other side is the joy. They are cute and it is an awesome gift to be able to be a part of their day to day lives. We are getting the chance to see first steps, learning to speak, and experiencing things for the first time. We get to cuddle and rock, giggle and squirm, and experience the wonder of innocence.

So is at a burden or a joy to watch these little guys as much as we do? The answer, of course, is both. The trick for me is to keep my focus on the joy and privilege. There is an old spiritual exercise that says in your time of morning devotion you should look over the tasks that are on your plate for the day. Then you should carefully and intentionally say to yourself, "Today I get to..." Notice the statement is not, "Today I have to....". It is "I get to". These are the tasks the Lord has given me for this day of faithful living.

I am not saying I do this perfectly, but it really does help make each item on my to-do list an opportunity rather than an obligation. God is our partner in every task that lays before us. Each day is a day the Lord has made and given to us as a gift. Whether the task is going out to dinner, changing a diaper, watching a movie, or balancing the checkbook, God invites us to be present in those tasks. He invites us to find the joy and purpose He intended to be in the center of all our life


