Are we going to have Easter services and laugh together about this? Should I get my funeral suit dry cleaned and ready to go?

I don't know. That is hard for me. I am advance planner. I have at least the next year carefully laid out in the calendar. How about you? How are you handling this unique time and the stress that comes with it? Are you resting in the Lord? Staying awake worrying? Enjoying the quiet? Craving getting out among people?

I guess that it part of the stress; being separated. It would be good to have a potluck and check in with each other. It would be nice to share the peace and get a hand shake or a hug, but we are told to social distance ourselves. That is good advice, and it is a way we help protect each other. We don't, however, have to spiritually distance ourselves. We can pray more deeply for each other and for St. James. We can use our forced time of solitude to increase our effort to connect to God and each other in prayer.

Hopefully, this will all blow over. Hopefully, we will all say be able to say it seemed overblown and overdone. However it works out. I hope it leaves us with a deeper appreciation of being able to gather on a Sunday morning and look at each other face to face. I look forward to sharing the peace with you all one day soon. Maybe I had been taking to many gifts for granted, and this is my (our) opportunity to be reminded of the precious gift that the Sabbath is when we can share it together.


