We don't usually spend a great deal of time examining the risk/reward equations in our life. Most of these decisions are pretty automatic. We know there is a risk in traveling in an automobile, but we long ago decided the rewards of getting out and about outweighed the risks. If the driver had been drinking, we just knew the risks outweighed the rewards. We made these sorts of decisions all the time. We would eat in a restaurant, despite the risks of food poisoning; well, unless the restaurant was really dirty.

Sometimes we trusted someone else to influence our decision. The doctor said the benefit of the medication was worth the risk of the side effects. Someone we love and trust told us it would be okay. Everyone else was getting in line, so maybe we should be willing to do so also.

What about now? This coronavirus has it all messed up. Should I go to the store? Is it safe to have my family member in my home? Can I visit with my neighbor? What if we stay on the porch? How extreme are the risks of this illness? Is this a bad flu or the bubonic plague?

And the experts, our loved ones, "everyone else"? They all say different things. We hear we must sanitize every box that comes into our house from the grocery store, but we also hear that the virus does not transmit from surfaces. The CDC says to social distance 6 feet apart. The World Health Organization says 1 meter (3 feet). Maybe our daughter says to loosen up, but our father says to head for the basement. The politicians and the media seem to be confusing it all by turning it into the predictable blue team versus red team reality show.

And what about church? Should we have church services? Should I go, if church services are offered?

It would be nice if these questions could be as comfortably answered as the ones we make routinely about riding in a car or taking a medication. However, these decisions are much murkier. I cannot help but think of 1 Corinthians 13.12 in the King James Version. "For now we see through a glass, darkly."

Our fellow church members, family members, and neighbors will all come to different answers about the questions of how to live out these months of pandemic. There is no common wisdom, and these decisions will only end when a vaccine or "herd immunity" are in place.

In the meantime we as Christians are called to treat each other with grace. Some people may be willing to take risks we might think are too great, or maybe we will think some people are giving up living and hiding in fear. I personally haven't worked out what the perfect balance is for myself, how can I know what it is for someone else? Pray about your decisions for living this needed pandemic lifestyle. Most of us thought this would be a short term affair, but it looks like is going to be a while. Prayer and devotion offers a chance to quiet ourselves and to look carefully at the choices we have to make. It puts those choices into the context of our faith and deepest values.

We cannot simply surrender to fear, but we also cannot simply throw caution to the wind. What does that mean for you, for me, for St. James? I'm not sure, but I leave you with a prayer by Martin Luther.

"Lord God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."
