PASTOR'S LETTER FOR July 2020





Dear Friends in Christ,

I am writing this during the week after our Re-Gathering Communion Service of Celebration this past Sunday. I am still marveling at how well it seemed to go! I am grateful for those who assisted in helping to carry it out according to the guidelines set by our Church Council. And I am grateful for Bob Hench for singing a beautiful solo while I stepped back into the sacristy to wash my hands for 20 seconds before distributing the communion wafers to those in attendance. And I am especially grateful for all who attended and followed the guidelines quite well! Everyone wore a mask and kept socially distanced appropriately. It was so good to be together again in worship of our Lord, even though we were all masked!

These masking, social distancing guidelines will be in place for awhile yet to come. No one knows how long. We are simply following the guidelines set by the CDC, the PA Department of Health, and recommended by our Bishop. In years to come, we may look back and laugh at some of the things we thought were necessary, but better that than looking back at all the people we lost because we didn't follow these recommendations!

After all, COVID-19 is still out there! We are friends with a couple whose 10-month-old tested positive for the virus last week! She's recovering fine, thank God, but her grandmother reminded everyone on Facebook that it is out there still! And most of us at St. James are at that higher risk age. Pastor Scott has asthma and heart arrhythmia which make him at an even higher risk. So thank you all for following the guidelines! As they say, "My mask protects you and your mask protects me." And as Christians, this is an opportunity for us to be witnesses for Christ by being polite, kind, peaceful, and patient with others.

I saw that polite patience and kindness demonstrated yesterday at the Dollar Tree store I went in to buy a couple of Father's Day cards. I found them within a minute or so and went to get in line to pay for them.

To my surprise, the line extended all the way down the aisle! There were nine people in front of me and only one cashier. She was dealing with a couple of women who had a return and a whole cartful of stuff to buy. Yes, it was a bit frustrating, but it was also joyful to see the reactions of the 9 people in line in front of me and the one woman who came after me. Everyone was being polite and courteous. We all got into a wonderful conversation about the masks on our faces and the lines on the floor to make for social distancing which we followed. We laughed about this way of life being the "new normal". And someone mentioned all the "Black Lives Matter" protests that have been going on all over our country. She said that while the horrible killing of George Floyd was terribly wrong, and people had every right to protest peacefully, it was certainly strange that they would gather for those protests but not attend church because it wasn't safe. They were huge nods of agreement from everyone in line! There was also agreement about the fact that we do still have a long way to go in correcting racism in our country, and about expressing our appreciation for all the good police officers out there, even though some corrections need to be made in many police departments. It was one of these rare moments of agreement in conversation between ten total strangers! When I finally checked out and left the store, I did so with a good feeling of hope for our world in spite of all the troubles going on everywhere.

I do not believe that God causes bad things to happen in this world. But I do believe, and know, that God can work His goodness in everything that happens. So, as I close, I am reminded of the third verse of the hymn, "This Is My Father's World". "This is my Father's world; oh, let me not forget that, though the wrong seems oft so strong, God is the ruler yet. This is my Father's world; why should my heart be sad? The Lord is king, let heaven ring; God reigns, let the earth be glad!" Hope to see you in church!
