FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S DESK August 2022

Dear Members of Saint James,

I hope that you are enjoying the wonderful summer that we are having this year. As we enter August, we start to look towards the end of the summer, and we feel stressed to get our summer activities in before fall. At this time of the year, everyone is anxious to try to get in their last vacation, camping trip, boating excursion, or other activities. All this end of summer planning is what the world tells us that we need to be about. Remember the world says rest, eat, drink, and be happy (Luke 12: 13-21). The world tells us that we are successful when we have grand vacations, the biggest toys, the most money, the most power and success. The world tells us that these are the things that make us successful in life and is the meaning of "the good life." The Good Life is an abundance of possessions. But success leads to one needing more and more success which means that we need to accumulate more and more toys. more possessions, more money, more power. All of which leaves us even more empty. We forget in all of this busy-ness that we will still die and leave everything to someone else. This results in someone else enjoying what we have accumulated in this life. Those things that we worked so hard to attain become someone else's possession or junk. All of your possessions are sold, someone else spends our money and our power and successes become someone's else power. But God tells us that having the most toys, money, power, success is to be rich in the world and we have treasure in this world, but you can take it with you. Therefore, the world tells us that we will be happy because life is a party.

But God tells us that this is a waste of time. Because when you have all these things even though the world tells us that we are happy, we still feel empty inside. The reality is most rich and successful people are empty, depressed, and sad. 




