# Pastor's April Musings Why Holy Week?

Dear Members of Saint James,

I am asked this question very often and to be honest, it is a good one. What is the point of going to what will be additional services (Maundy Thursday & Good Friday) because we know Jesus died and eventually wasn't found in the tomb on Easter Sunday? I hear the story on Palm/Passion Sunday and will then just come back on Easter Sunday, it feels like too much.

Why I won't disagree with someone for choosing to not attend these additional services but there is just some indescribable when it comes to Holy Week. Not only do we get to experience Jesus's time in Jerusalem in a way which is much different than a typical Sunday Worship service, but sometimes these services enlighten us in ways we never have imagined before. As we gather stripping the altar in hearing the words from Psalm 22 (My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning? O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but find no rest.) to see a blank altar which had flowers, candles, and communion ware just moments prior sends chills down your spine as you consider how Jesus was stripped of his freedom and humanity when he was arrested. Gathering in the midst of darkness and hearing Jesus say "it is finished" on Good Friday has us aching at the question of "WHY IS THIS GOOD?!?!?!" As I write this newsletter, preparing for this special week, I am literally smiling and having chills for what this experience will be like for myself and hopefully others.

I consider what this week means for many of us. For some of us, we have been dealing with 40 days of despair (not saying Lent is despairing, but it calls us to reflect on the sin and sorrow within our lives). Some of us may be in the midst of struggle (hospitalizations, frustrations of the world, upset that your March Madness bracket became a bust after the 1st round. or whatever you are dealing with as you read this letter). Holy Week is a time where we gather together and get knee deep in the story of Christ's life, death, and resurrection. This is a story which we don't just talk about but it is an experience which we get to take part in for one week which is the center of our faith. While I could continue telling why you should be at these services, but I think that downplays why we come. Instead, I invite you to partake in what is one of the greatest weeks of our faith. Join me in how we gather for one of the most powerful weeks in history, which will change the world forever. If I do not see you for any of our services at Bethany, I pray you do get to experience how it isn't the darkness which defines you in your life. Instead, know it is the life and light brought to us in the Resurrection of Easter, which frees us from despairs and the sins of our world. May you truly ring the "Alleluias" of life which we experience everyday.

### **Holy Week Services**

Holy Week is the most sacred week of the Christian Church year. We are asked to remember and experience the week which changed the world and hopefully change us as well. This is a week which we get to experience Christ's passion and see how it isn't just another week on the calendar. The following services are here to help us experience the kind of love which was shown on the first Holy Week. We hope you are able to attend and experience a closeness of God's love for us and the world.

### Palm Sunday- April 2<sup>nd</sup> 10:45 AM

With a joyful noise, we gather at the entrance of Jerusalem waiving our palms. We shout "Hosanna" (save now!) as our cry for a broken world. "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!" (Luke 19:38) This service serves as a wonderful opportunity to begin our journey with Jesus to the cross.



# Maundy Thursday- April 6th 6:00PM (This service will be at Bethany this year!)



"Lord make our sad divisions soon to cease; draw us all closer, each to each, we plead, by drawing all to you, O Prince of peace." (ELW 463)

On this sacred night, we remember the final night which Jesus gathered with the original twelve disciples sharing with them the commandments of Love and Grace through meal and the washing of feet. This is a night which we give

thanks for the gift of communion as we are mere hours away from his death on the cross. We will be gathering with our friends, at Bethany, as we will celebrate this holy night with Dinner Church (a similar service which we have been using during the Lenten Mid-Week gatherings).

The altar is stripped as we remember Jesus being stripped of his freedom as we hear the words of Psalm 22 preparing us for Good Friday.

### Good Friday-April 7th 2:00PM

(Communion will not be celebrated)

We gather at the foot of the cross to hear the words of Jesus's agonizing death for us and for our salvation. In this service of remembrance we ponder his trial, his torture, his carrying the cross, his crucifixion and burial through the use of Scripture and hymns. We also hear the final words of Jesus by candlelight and leave in darkness and silence this night.





# THE RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD (EASTER SUNDAY) April 9<sup>th</sup> 10:45AM

It has finally arrived!! If you ever wonder if there was a day in which the world was changed, the first Easter was that day. We

gather to celebrate Christ being Raised from the Dead!!!

Death, sin, fear, cruelty, injustice, and evil no longer have the final say in our lives because the final words belong to Jesus. Christ is risen and we celebrate that freedom!

The church will be decorated to celebrate this momentous occasion.
