#### Vice Pastor's Report July 2023

#### **Pastor's July Musings**

United in Christ-Synod Assembly Review

I figured for this edition of my musings, it would be good to reflect on the happenings of our recent Synod Assembly which took place on June 17<sup>th</sup>. We gathered at the Blair County Convention Center for a 1 (one) day assembly. Before gathering on June 17<sup>th</sup>, for our first in person assembly since Covid, we held a in person worship service the week prior and had two zoom based Bible Studies with our ELCA presenter/Bible Study leader (Kristen Opalinkski-*Manager for Ecumenical and Inter-Religious Relations for the ELCA*). Our theme for this assembly was *United in Christ* as a way to remind us through the various undertakings in this world and our faith, we are united together.

I am thankful for representation between Bethany (Rhonda Barry & Terry Koch) and St James (Lori Savino & Donna Wilt). Our day included voting on a variety of Synodical positions from Council to other committees, we discussed the budget (which I will flush out a little further below), 2024 compensation manual for clergy, and heard a variety of reports from Synod Staff, Synod Partners like Penn State Campus Ministry and Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in Pennsylvania (LAMPa), and a 3<sup>rd</sup> Bible Study with Ms. Opalinkski focused on unity. We also had conversations about some new ventures and things in the works through the synod office.

Currently, the Synod Office is redefining its Mission Statement as part of a rebranding and refocusing. During Rev. Kevin Schock, Assistant to the Bishop/Director of Evangelical Mission, report we heard a variety of words which the Synod Council were discerning. Pastor Kevin felt a good exercise would for the assembly help narrow down this group of words (Love, Collaborate, Affirm, Rury, etc) to 3 words which will hopefully be part of a mission statement in the

coming months. Also during Pastor Kevin's report, he called for our congregations to envision ways we can be active participants with our members and with our communities. During Bishop Paula's time, we participated in a beautiful devotion to open ourselves to our time together.

The large actions taken during our assembly revolved around budgetary items as our assembly discerned a possible venture. We not only adjusted some miscalculations in the approved 2022-2023 budget. We than discussed looking towards a staff adjustment moving towards 2024. Bishop Craig Miller of Upper Susquehanna Synod (areas like Lewistown, Danville, Lewisburg, etc) reached out to Bishop Paul about sharing a Director of Evangelical Mission (currently filled part-time by Pastor Kevin) between the two synods. This would off course involved some budgeting changes because part of Pastor Kevin's compensation is covered through our national church wide's office. Through conversations with the assembly and prayer, our body voted to have further conversations with Upper Susquehanna to share a Dir of Evangelical Mission. and move Pastor Kevin to full time capacity as Assistant to the Bishop. If this process goes through, this will bring the synod staffing back to how it was Pre-2019 with a FT Bishop, FT Assistant, PT Dir of Evangelical Mission at the synod office which we hope will help bring additional visibility and partnerships with the synod. Stay tuned to further development in this area.

While to some, this seems like Synod Assembly is a boring because it is filled with business and not much else. This assembly felt significant because it was our first in person assembly since Covid but it also provided as a time to remind us of how we are a community are united as beloved children. May we continue to strive to seek ways we are united in Christ.




