

Pastor's September Musings

United in Christ-Synod Assembly Review

Fall is always a unique season in the year. I would say how the "programming year of the church" starts again but we have had a busy summer. Our combined picnic worships with Bethany have done very well. We are further exploring some future gatherings because theses seemed to be enjoyed by all. There are the various other activities our various partners have had throughout the synod.

Fall is no different for the type of changes we have at St James. Our worship service will have some fall/harvest undertones, we have the assorted fall festival Sundays of Reformation, All Saints, and conclude with Christ the King in November before transitioning into Advent, we also continue to explore the various ways in which the Spirit is calling us to do ministry in our respective communities. It is always a unique time as we enter into this phase of the calendar year & the church year as we reflect and as we consider where the life of the Church continues moving forward.

At our last picnic worship, the gospel text was the calming of the sea/Peter stepping out of the boat to meet Jesus. This is a unique text for a variety of reasons, but I am always struck with just the difference of encounters between the disciples and just how this similar encounter plays out for us today. In the case of the gospel lesson, we have the disciples who are petrified on the boat by everything happening from the storm to whether they are seeing a ghost as Jesus walks on the water. Peter, who I am suspecting also has a sense of trepidation follows Jesus call to "come out" onto the waters. There are a variety of ways in which we as followers of Jesus are terrified to step out and want to stay on the boat (even if it isn't the safest option). Yet, there are those moments in which we, even in our uncertain and terror, take the step to see what Jesus has instore for us.

Stepping off the boat to meet Jesus may include the realization of sinking a bit because we have either lost sight or got a little too ahead of ourselves. Yet, Jesus still reaches out to us to say "you are on the right path" and gives us the opportunity to continue to live into this life of faith and grace. Jesus also continues to speak to those of us still on the boat, not to shame us but to say in due time and with a little help we also will step out to walk with Jesus. I think many of us are afraid to take this step because we have a little fear how we are the only ones on those waters but Jesus will remind us how we aren't doing this alone.

Friends, as we continue into this season of calling and change, as we hear Jesus call out to us to come and we are uncertain if the boat of the crashing waters is the best place to be...may we be reminded how in this journey of faith, we do so as a community and we do so with Christ who continues to be the hand reaching out and guiding us, always.






Bible Study Update
