

Vice Pastor's Report January 2024

Pastor's January Musings

What is word?

We have finally arrived to a new year, it still is hard to settle in on how it is now 2024 and not 2023 (especially as pastor is writing this before Christmas). Yet, with a new year, we always make that attempt to get rid of the things which may have brought us down in the previous year and start anew. This various from stuff, mindset, or even sometimes specific individuals. A practice I have tried over the past couple of years is to consider what my theme/mantra is for the coming year. What are my hopes and dreams for the coming year? This is hopefully to go beyond the typical New Year's Resolution of wanting to lose weight or read more or whatever you have tried to do but will lose interest before the end of the month, if you are lucky. One way I have been trying to create this theme for the coming year is through the practice of Jon Gordon's *One Word that will change your life*. This practice is usually to pray and discern what you hope for the coming year to be and through this activity, a specific word will be the theme throughout the year. From there you will hopefully consider ways in which you live out that theme or word.

While a 2024 word has not been designated, this activity has been helpful to try and keep my mindset for the year. One year, my word was *Change* and I worked to relieve some areas in which I took notice where always controlling my mind especially after Covid and so I focused on trying to let go of things which I could not control and got back into Spiritual Direction (think of this as a practice where your pastor has their own pastor to help them process and discern what is going in their life).

This is also part of the reason I got the Hebrew words "Shalom/Peace" tattooed on my wrist to serve as that reminder to give peace to others while also give peace to myself.

When we gathered on Christmas Eve, we heard "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." (John 1:1). Why is this important to consider the power of one word. For us, at Christmas, we are reminded how the Word became flesh. Scripture and the belief of God became physically present in Jesus in all the human/fleshiness, just like us. Jesus would be fully divine in sharing the holy encounters of God but also experience being fully human in love, heartbreak, and fellowship which we have with one another. It is also this Word coming among us which has impact which goes beyond a single year but still becomes a focus for us all. What focus can we experience when we encounter the Word of Christ? I feel when we keep the Word in our forefront, we may be very surprised where the Church can go.

For 2024, may you find not only a specific word which speaks to you for the coming year but let us also experience the Word which goes beyond all understanding. Then as we listen together what the Word is calling us, let us join in the whole Church to be the change in the world which God calls us to be.

Wednesday Bible Study (Every Wednesday at 1pm in the Basement Fellowship Hall): On January 10th we will beginning a brand new study and it is one in which many have been asking for quite some time....*REVELATION*. That is right, we will be studying the book of Revelation on Wednesdays as this intriguing book has become the most researched and talked about book in the entire Bible. We hope to see you as we take a weekly dive into these words of hope for all.



2024 Synod Assembly & Synod Nominations

Synod Assembly is around the corner, ok its really 6 months away. We are thankful for Rob Stere, Rhonda Barry, & Pastor Drew whom will be serving as voting delegates this year. Our Assembly will be on Saturday, June 15th at the Blair County Convention Center. There will be a synod wide worship service on Friday, June 14th at Zion Lutheran in Hollidaysburg (more details on the service will be forth coming. We are grateful for the various ways in which our people serve here at Bethany. Various individuals are also needed at the Synod level to help them do the work of the church. Below is a list of assorted ways in which you can help the synod. If you are interested or would like further information, please let Pastor Drew and he will be able to get you further information.

Synod Council (3 Yr. Term by Assembly Vote, Youth-2 Yr Term) Each person elected to the Synod Council shall be a voting member of a congregation of this synod, with the exception of ordained ministers on the roster of this synod who reside outside the territory of this synod. The process for election and the term of office when not otherwise provided shall be specified in the bylaws. A member of the Church Council of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, unless otherwise elected as a voting member of the Synod Council, may serve as an advisory member of the Synod Council with voice but not vote. Meetings are held Bi-Monthly (every other month) or if a special meeting is called by Bishop and/or council members.

Consultation Committee (6 Yr. Term by Assembly Vote)

The Consultation Committee of this synod shall consist of at least six persons and not more than 12 persons, of whom half shall be ordained ministers and half shall be laypersons, who shall each be elected by the Synod Assembly for a term of six years without consecutive reelection. The functions of the Consultation Committee are set forth in Chapter 20 of the Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and in Chapter 17 of this Constitution. The size of the Consultation Committee, in accord with this provision, shall be defined in this synod's bylaws. Committee is on call at the request of the Bishop.

Discipline Committee (6 Yr Term by Assembly Vote)

From the ELCA Constitution: There shall be set forth in the bylaws a process of discipline governing officers, ministers of Word and Sacrament, ministers of Word and Service, congregations, and members of congregations. Except as provided in 20.18. or 20.19., such process shall assure due process and due protection for the accused, other parties, and this church. Since synods have responsibility for admittance of persons into the rostered ministries of this church and have oversight of pastoral and congregational relationships, the disciplinary process shall be a responsibility of the synod on behalf of this church. Committee is on call at the request of the Bishop.

Voting Delegate for the 2025 Churchwide Assembly in Phoenix, Arizonia (July 28-August 2, 2025)

This is part of the Tri-annual denominational event where various delegates from all 65 Synods, across the ELCA, will attend to do the work of the church which includes worship, learning about the various ministries of the ELCA, and experience the designated host city. The cost for this event is covered by the ELCA. If you are interested or have questions, please contact Pastor Drew as he has attended the 2019 & 2022 Churchwide Assemblies.



Ash Wednesday-February 14th

As we prepare for the Lenten journey to the cross, we begin with the mark of ashes. These ashes remind us, we return to dust as we came from dust. I think by placing ashes in the sign of the cross, we are reminded outwardly of the sins which Jesus takes to the cross. It is at the cross, our sins (which vary greatly person to person) die in Jesus's final moments. Not only does Ash Wednesday start the season of Lent, but it serves as a reminder to us of our ongoing commitment to the implications of the Resurrection in our own lives. This implication leads to our death in which we will be reborn through the Resurrection of Christ. The cross of ash on individual's heads serves as that visual reminder.



Then there will be two worship opportunities:12 noon at St James & 7p at Bethany. We pray your journey in Lent this year, will be a journey which you experience the cross in a new way.

All are welcome! Register online or call the office.


