I was having a conversation with a recent visit and the individual was asking me when the next big Christian Holiday was. I assumed they were speaking to Easter as not everyone else is as much of a liturgical nut as me. When I expressed how Easter falls on March 31st, the person was then trying to count in their head when Ash Wednesday falls and I replied with February 14th. These dates are not quite the earliest Easter can fall, in fact the earliest is March 22nd but that hasn't happened since 1818 and won't again until 2285. As you can guess, Ash Wednesday and Lent tend to sneak up on us as we are putting away the Christmas decorations.


As our conversation continued, because they realized Valentines Day coincides with Ash Wednesday, there was wondering how these two holidays will play together. 

Bible Study Update

As we continue our journey of faith, we continue with diving deeper into our faith through our two bible study opportunities. We are excited as we will begin two brand new series in the coming month.

Wednesday Bible Study (Every Wednesday at 1:00 p.m. in the Basement Fellowship Hall): On January 10th we will beginning a brand-new study and it is one in which many have been asking for quite some time...*REVELATION*. That is right, we will be studying the book of Revelation on Wednesdays as this intriguing book has become the most researched and talked about book in the entire Bible. We hope to see you as we take a weekly dive into these words of hope for all.

Faith on Tap (1st & 3rd Tuesday at Marzoni's in Greenwood, 6:00 p.m.): On February 20th we will begin a new series which will be fitting going into Lent. We will do a series entitled, "Broken Signpost" which will be influenced by NT Wright's 2020 book Broken Signposts: How Christianity Makes Sense of the World. N. T. Wright argues that every world view must explain seven "signposts", indicators inherent to humanity: justice, spirituality, relationships, beauty, freedom, truth, and power. If we do not live up to these ideals our societies and individual lives become unbalanced, creating anger and frustration - negative emotions that divide us from ourselves and from God, he contends. Join us on Feb 20th as we talk about the broken signpost we miss.

2024 Synod Assembly & Synod Nominations

Synod Assembly is around the corner, ok its really 6 months away. We are thankful for Rob Stere, Rhonda Barry, & Pastor Drew whom will be serving as voting delegates this year. Our Assembly will be on Saturday, June 15th at the Blair County Convention Center. There will be a synod wide worship service on Friday, June 14th at Zion Lutheran in Hollidaysburg (more details on the service will be forth coming. We are grateful for the various ways in which our people serve here at Bethany. Various individuals are also needed at the Synod level to help them do the work of the church. Below is a list of assorted ways in which you can help the synod. If you are interested or would like further information, please let Pastor Drew and he will be able to get you further information.

Synod Council (3 Yr. Term by Assembly Vote, Youth-2 Yr Term) Each person elected to the Synod Council shall be a voting member of a congregation of this synod, with the exception of ordained ministers on the roster of this synod who reside outside the territory of this synod. The process for election and the term of office when not otherwise provided shall be specified in the bylaws. A member of the Church Council of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, unless otherwise elected as a voting member of the Synod Council, may serve as an advisory member of the Synod Council with voice but not vote. Meetings are held Bi-Monthly (every other month) or if a special meeting is called by Bishop and/or council members.

Consultation Committee (6 Yr. Term by Assembly Vote)

The Consultation Committee of this synod shall consist of at least six persons and not more than 12 persons, of whom half shall be ordained ministers and half shall be laypersons, who shall each be elected by the Synod Assembly for a term of six years without consecutive reelection. The functions of the Consultation Committee are set forth in Chapter 20 of the Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and in Chapter 17 of this Constitution. The size of the Consultation Committee, in accord with this provision, shall be defined in this synod's bylaws. Committee is on call at the request of the Bishop.

Discipline Committee (6 Yr Term by Assembly Vote)

From the ELCA Constitution: There shall be set forth in the bylaws a process of discipline governing officers, ministers of Word and Sacrament, ministers of Word and Service, congregations, and members of congregations. Except as provided in 20.18. or 20.19., such process shall assure due process and due protection for the accused, other parties, and this church. Since synods have responsibility for admittance of persons into the rostered ministries of this church and have oversight of pastoral and congregational relationships, the disciplinary process shall be a responsibility of the synod on behalf of this church. Committee is on call at the request of the Bishop.

Voting Delegate for the 2025 Churchwide Assembly in Phoenix, Arizonia (July 28-August 2, 2025)

This is part of the Tri-annual denominational event where various delegates from all 65 Synods, across the ELCA, will attend to do the work of the church which includes worship, learning about the various ministries of the ELCA, and experience the designated host city. The cost for this event is covered by the ELCA. If you are interested or have questions, please contact Pastor Drew as he has attended the 2019 & 2022 Churchwide Assemblies.



Ash Wednesday-February 14th

As we prepare for the Lenten journey to the cross, we begin with the mark of ashes. These ashes remind us, we return to dust as we came from dust. I think by placing ashes in the sign of the cross, we are reminded outwardly of the sins which Jesus takes to the cross. It is at the cross, our sins (which vary greatly person to person) die in Jesus's final moments. Not only does Ash Wednesday start the season of Lent, but it serves as a reminder to us of our ongoing commitment to the implications of the Resurrection in our own lives. This implication leads to our death in which we will be reborn through the Resurrection of Christ. The cross of ash on individual's heads serves as that visual reminder.

There will be a variety of options for Ash Wednesday: Pastor Drew will be hosting "Ashes to Go" at Church from 7am-9am & then Greenbean Coffeehouse from 2p-4p. Then there will be two worship opportunities:12 noon at St James & 7p at Bethany. If none of these times do not work for you or if you are unable to come to the worship services, please let Pastor Drew know and we can figure out a separate time. We pray your journey in Lent this year, will be a journey which you experience the cross in a new way.



Lenten Series 2024

Created for Community Wednesdays, 6pm Starting Feb 21st

On Ash Wednesday, we enter into a season together with "the whole church." It goes to say that we are created for communion with God, one another, and called to live in harmony with creation." Lent serves as a time for deepening our sense of community. This Lenten Season, we will take a deeper dive in our sense of community within a variety of avenues (creation, saints, Christ, our neighbors, and those on the margins). We will also have this in a Dinner Church Style format, similar to last year's Lenten Services. We are still formatting the host schedule between Bethany & St James (keep an eye out on Facebook or Sunday Bulletins). We hope you will join us for what will be a wonder experience of food, fellowship, and deeper sense of community.

Feeding Partnership with St Luke's Episcopal


