

Pastor's May Musings

Choose your own adventure!

One of my dear friends from camp was a big fan of "Choose your own adventure" books. For those who don't know this style of writing, you come to the end of a page/chapter, and you are given a choice of what you want the next steps to be. This could involve taking the trail leading to a castle or the trail leading to a swamp or something else which creatively relates to the scenario. In fact, my friend's favorite road trip activity was reading them as one is traveling from place to place, which is very fitting. Several years ago, her and I were taking a road trip from Ohio-> Philadelphia to visit a fellow camp friend-> to Florida where we would work on leadership staff that summer and yes, we did the choose your own adventure reading. With that being over 15 years ago, I cannot tell you the story and the various ways in which we moved the narrative, what I can say is it made driving on I-95 a little easier.

This Easter, we read from the Gospel of Mark which has its own choose your own adventure narrative. There is typically the short version which ends with Mark 16: 8, When the women ran from the tomb, they were confused and shaking all over. They were too afraid to tell anyone what had happened. (Common English Version) or the extended version of Mark 16:9-20 which involves Jesus appearing to Mary Magdalene, two other disciples, commissioning the disciples & his ascension. If you feel I am joking, you are more than welcome to look up the short ending or long ending in Mark. *I think we as Christians who celebrate Easter tend to lean towards the longer edition. *

Yet, as we are post Easter Sunday and empty tomb, we also are in a choose your own adventure setting: we can just have things go back to normal, we can just not speak about easter unless someone ask you where the pretty Tulips came from, or we can speak to how the Easter experience was meaningful to you. How you choose to live into the coming months, Post-Easter, is truly up to you. Yet, I want you to consider what each choice could bring. Nothing could happen or maybe you create a space for someone to share what Easter and the experience of faith means to them. Yes, there is the possibility you opened Pandora's box where someone unpacks a lot of religious baggage, but you may just find yourself in a situation where you are showing your friend how you are there to be with them in the midst of that experience. Let me also stress, that if it is something heavy, help your friend(s) seek the necessary mental or spiritual trained personnel who can walk with your friend(s) in a safer environment.

No matter which adventure you choose to continue in, know how the Easter Promise of Christ's resurrection continues to claim and live within each of us. It serves as a reminder how God never tires of us and is always a part of us. While we may be afraid & amazed by the Easter adventure, it is one in which we boldly continue.


