

By the time you are reading this, the news has already been shared of my & Pastor Amanda's departure to Maryland where we will be serving new calls. For many, we have been fortunate enough to be able to share our goodbyes and celebrate the wonderful ministry we have had together, these past 9 years. For some, we have been unable to have those conversations and it breaks my heart not having the time to do so.

As I have been in the midst of backing up my office, I have come across a wide variety of keepsakes from cards, bulletins, notes, and so much more. It truly is hard to put into words as I reflect on the joys and sorrows of ministry. I think about all the celebrations which have included joint worship services, our first worship service from the original covid lockdown, call Sunday in May 2015, the first ventures of Faith on Tap, and pictures of the Descending Jesus Balloon from Ascension Sunday.
