# FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S DESK March 2025

Dear Members of St. James:

Grace, mercy and peace from God, our Father, and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. As we enter into the season of Lent, we are reminded of our true nature that we are sinners at our core. This sinful nature controls our lives, because we are governed by sin, death and the Devil. Ash Wednesday reminds us that we are dead in our sins and that we will die because of our sins. Lent reminds us that we are sinners and that we need to repent of these sins. Lent also reminds us that this world is filled with sin and evil. Lent brings us to the realization that we are sinners. We therefore have no salvation in ourselves for the Law shows us we are sinners, and our works only show that we fail miserably because we don't do enough good work and what good works that we do are led by self-interest and sin. It reminds me of what Paul said, "Oh, what a wretched man that I am.", because there is nothing within us that can saved us.

Therefore, in Lent we are confronted by what we truly are, condemned because of our sins and that we are facing God's wrath because of this sin. We understand that there is nothing within us that can save us. We are doomed to life eternally condemned to Hell. But Lent leads us to the realization that there is more to this life than just sin, that there is our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ who came into this world to die for us, so that our sins might be forgiven, and we may have eternal life through His Resurrection. This is the hope that Lent gives us as we look forward to the Easter season and to the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

It gives us the hope that we too who were baptized into Christ's Death and Resurrection, that we too will have eternal life with Him because God has chosen us to be children of God. Chosen not because of what we do, but because of the love of God that is in Christ. That we might have our sins forgiven and that we may have eternal life in Heaven. Not because of own doings, but because of Christ's Death on the Cross. A redeeming death that brings us eternal life. This is the message of Lent and the hope that we have in the season of Easter that is to come.

In the season of Lent, I ask you to look into yourself and understand that you are sinful and that you need to repent of our sin. But through the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ, we have forgiveness of sins and eternal life in the Kingdom of Heaven. Therefore, I challenge you to believe in Jesus Christ and the grace that comes through His Death and Resurrection, because our every sin is covered, and our sins are no more. We are under the grace of God who loved us so much that he gave His only begotten Son to die for us, so that we shall not perish but have eternal life in Christ Jesus.

Holy Week is the most sacred week of the Christian Church year. We are asked to remember and experience the week which changed the world and hopefully change us as well. This is a week which we get to experience Christ's passion and see how it isn't just another week on the calendar.

The following services are here to help us experience the kind of love which was shown on the first Holy Week. We hope you are able to attend and experience a closeness of God's love for us and the world.

# Palm Sunday—April 13<sup>th</sup> 10:45 AM We will return to sanctuary on this day!



With a joyful noise, we gather at the entrance of Jerusalem waiving our palms. We shout "Hosanna" (save now!) as our cry for a broken world. "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!" (Luke 19:38) This service serves as a wonderful opportunity to begin our journey with Jesus to the cross.



# Maundy Thursday- April 17th 7:00 PM

"Lord make our sad divisions soon to cease; draw us all closer, each to each, we plead, by drawing all to you, O Prince of peace." (ELW 463)

On this sacred night, we remember the final night which Jesus gathered with the original twelve disciples sharing with them the commandments of Love and Grace through meal and the washing of feet. This is a night which we give thanks for the gift of communion as we are mere hours away from his death on the cross. This service will be celebrated in the Dinner Church Style which we have been using throughout our Midweek Lenten Services.

# Good Friday-April 18th 2:00PM

(Communion will not be celebrated)



We gather at the foot of the cross to hear the words of Jesus's agonizing death for us and for our salvation. In this service of remembrance we ponder his trial, his torture, his carrying the cross, his crucifixion and burial through the use of Scripture and hymns. We also hear the final words of Jesus by candlelight and leave in darkness and silence this night.



# THE RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD (EASTER SUNDAY) April 20th 10:45AM



It has finally arrived!! If you ever wonder if there was a day in which the world was changed, the first Easter was that day. We gather to celebrate Christ being Raised from the Dead!!!
