

FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S DESK May 2025

Dear Members of St. James:

Grace, mercy and peace from God, our Father, and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. As we begin the time after the Easter celebration, the time when we start to think about Spring. Spring is a symbol of rebirth where we move from the Winter season into the season of Spring which is a time of renewal which we see all around us. After Easter, we enter the seven-week period of the Easter season. During this Easter season, we do not talk about new birth, but we talked about the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. We looked at the Easter season as the time when Jesus Christ rose from the dead. But we must remember that because of Christ's Death on the Cross and His Resurrection, that Christ overcame sin, death, and the devil. The biggest of those things is His Victory over Death.

Over the next few weeks, we will hear a lot of stories about Jesus' Resurrection and Jesus' activities after His death. We will hear of times when Jesus is alive after His death, His coming to visiting His disciples, and Him giving us encouragement that there is life after death. Jesus tells us that death is not the end, but only the beginning of a new life, a new life in the Kingdom of God in Heaven.

Jesus has told us that if we are baptized into His Death, that we are also baptized into His Resurrection and have eternal life. In His Resurrection, we will receive a body just like His, a new spiritual body that is quite different from our earthly bodies that suffer pain, get old, and die. In the Resurrection, we will be given a new body that is Eternal that does not experience pain, never gets old, and never suffers death. Through Jesus Christ, we are promised a new life in Him. A life where we will be with Him for all Eternity, because He has gone to prepare a place for us. So that wherever He is, we will also be with Him for all Eternity in the Kingdom of God where Jesus Christ is our Lord and Savior, and God is our Father. This is the promise of Jesus Christ's Resurrection and the eternal life that we are given through Jesus Christ who loved us so much that He was willing to give up His life on this earth to die for our sins on a Cross. He was then raised from the dead, so that we might have Eternal life in Him. This is truly a gift that God has given us through His Son Jesus Christ through our faith in God Grace. This is the Blessings that we have received through the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ


