# FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S DESK October 2025

Dear Members of St. James:

Grace, mercy and peace from God, our Father, and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. As we enter the month of October, I'm reminded that this is the 208th anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation in which Dr. Martin Luther nailed to the door of Wittenberg Castle Church the 95 Theses on October 31, 1517. Luther's intentions was not to bring about a revolution within the Church, but his intent was simply to have an academic discussion among his colleagues about theology that was being propagated within the Catholic Church. He wanted to bring attention to the fact that salvation was not something to be earned through good works, but God's grace was a free gift given by God through the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. These 95 theses brought about the Lutheran Reformation which involved several theological changes including the reduction of the number of sacraments from 7 down to only two sacraments namely Baptism and Communion. One of the greatest things that came out of the Reformation was the theology of "Grace Alone, Faith Alone, and Scripture Alone." Scripture Alone means that we can depend on and explain everything related to theology through the Scriptures, because Scripture is the only authority and anything else is a lie. Faith Alone means that we believe in the Salvation that comes to us through God's Grace. It is this Faith in Christ that brings us salvation and eternal life, without this Faith in Jesus Christ we are lost. Grace Alone tells us that we are saved by grace not by good works that we do or by earning our salvation, but God's Salvation comes to us through Grace which is a free gift that we do not deserve.

Another part of Luther's theology is the idea of the "Bondage of the Will." Luther was expressing that we are by our nature, sinful; therefore, we will always perform evil works and deeds. Simply because it's our nature. We do not, by our own power, have the ability to do God's Will because of our sin. The only way that we can a good Christian is by the intervention of the Holy Spirit in our lives and that through this Holy Spirit we have the ability to do God's Will and are able to do good works. Therefore, we are not able on our own to truly believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God and the Savior of our souls. This knowledge only comes through the power of the Holy Spirit to reveal to us that Christ is the only way to God's salvation. For Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Light and no one can come unto the Father except through Jesus Christ.

Another Lutheran theology is the "Theology of the Cross" which teaches us that God sees us through the Cross through the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. The "Theology of the Cross" is what gets us our salvation. God's grace in the Death of Jesus Christ on the Cross allows us to be saved. Because by our own abilities, we would fail, and salvation would never be ours. Jesus is the only way to God salvation through His Death and Resurrection.

As we go through this month of October, let's remember the Reformation and all that Martin Luther has given to us through his Lutheran theology. Because of his deep commitment to Christ, he has revealed to us, the importance of Jesus Christ in our lives and that Jesus is the Way unto our Salvation through His Death and Resurrection. Praise be unto Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

I pray that God may truly bless you with the grace that Jesus Christ won for us on the Cross and may we celebrate the Reformation of the Church and the Reformation of our lives through Jesus Christ,
