#### FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S DESK September 2025

Dear Members of St. James:

Grace, mercy and peace from God, our Father, and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. As we enter the month of September, we are faced with the holiday of Labor Day which speaks of both labor and rest. Labor Day is not simply a holiday of rest where we take a break from the work that we do in this world. But it is a time that speaks to us of both rest and labor in our spiritual lives.


