FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S DESK November 2025

Dear Members of St. James:

Grace, mercy and peace from God, our Father, and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. As we enter the month of November, we celebrate Thanksgiving. Thanksgiving is associated with being thankful for what we have in this life. If we are thankful, we should be thankful to the one who gives us everything, who is God. The idea of giving thanks to God can only be accomplished through the power of prayer. How we give thanks to God is through our prayers. So, I want to talk a little bit about prayer. As I think about prayer, it causes me to consider that there is a process that we must use when we pray. When we pray, we must be persistent in our prayers, we must pray within God's will, and we must have faith in what we pray.

One of the things that Jesus reminds us to be in our prayers is to be persistent, to never give up, to pray constantly, and to continuously bring our petitions before God. When we pray, we must realize our prayers are always answered, but the answer to our prayers can be one of three things: yes, your prayers are answered; no, your prayers are not answered, or wait and see how God carries out His plan for us and our prayers. We must remember that we can't pester God until He gives us what we want, because that sounds a lot like works. God is a God of grace not a God who is persuaded or coaxed into doing what we want when we do something for God. That is not Grace. God loves us and knows what we need and knows what our prayers are, before we even pray them. God also knows what good things that we need, because He is our Heavenly Father. We must always be careful that when we pray persistently; that we do not assume that we're not praying hard enough, if our prayers are not answered. The true answer may be simply God is saying no to our request or simply to wait. When God says no to our prayers, it is usually because He has a better plan for us and knows what is better for us.

This brings me to the other aspect that we must understand about prayer. Our prayers must always be in sync with God's Good Will. Because we have the Holy Spirit, we know what God's Will is and we pray in accordance with God's Holy Will. That's why we never pray for the things of this world like wealth or power. We pray for others and for ourselves that God's Will is accomplished, not that we will benefit from our prayer; but our prayer will always bring glory unto God. God will always give us what we truly need and God will give us more than we could ever ask for. This is the Will of our Loving God.

The last thing that we must remember about our prayers is that we must always believe that our prayers will be accomplished. In our words, we must have faith that God will give us in accordance to His Holy Will as to what He believes that is the best for us and for others.

So remember when you pray, be persistent but always within the Will of God through the power of the Holy Spirit, and to believe in what you are praying for and that God will accomplish His Good Will in our lives and in the lives of other people to the glory of God, the Father, the Almighty, Amen.

I pray with persistence and faith that God may truly bless you with the grace that Jesus Christ won for us on the Cross. What more can we be more thankful for than forgiven of sins and eternal life that comes to us through the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior,


