FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S DESK December 2025

Dear Members of St. James:

Grace, mercy and peace from God, our Father, and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. In this busy season of Christmas, as the world go about in a frantic state, we are called to cry out just like John the Baptist. We are to be the ones in the world who are crying out, prepare the way of the Lord and make His paths straight. We should be calling the world to repent and to look to the Kingdom of God. We need to cry out in this chaotic world that we have sinned against our neighbors and against God. We need to repent and believe that Jesus Christ has died for our sins so that we can receive forgiveness.

We should be shouting out in this world about the Glory of the Lord who is Jesus Christ coming to the world this Christmas season to save us from our sins. We are to tell everyone the Good News that the Son of God, Jesus Christ, has come into the world. Jesus came into this world gently and humbly, but with great power to save us from our sins. In this time of the year, we are reminded of the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem, which is Good News, but we should also be aware of Jesus Christ died on the Cross for us. The world wants to celebrate the Holidays with gifts, but Jesus came into the world to give us the greatest of all gifts, His Life as a ransom for our lives. The Church sees the death of Jesus on the Cross as the most powerful act that has ever occurred in human history. Jesus came into the world to save us by God's Grace. Jesus has come into the world to feed us with His Word, to gather us into His Church, to gently lead us through this world of chaos to bring us into His Kingdom, and in the end to carry us to be with Him in Heaven that He has prepared for us through His Death and Resurrection.

I pray that the Holy Lord embolden you to shout out the joys of Jesus Christ coming into the world to save us from our sins by His dying on the Cross. And to cry out in thanksgiving for God's gift of Grace. May you have a blessed Advent Season and a Holy Christmas.


